

God is Beyond Our Comprehension — But His Word is Not

1. God's Full Being Is Beyond Human Comprehension

- Job 11:7 (NIV): "Can you fathom the mysteries of God? Can you probe the limits of the Almighty?"
- Fact: God's full existence — His total power, eternity, and spirit nature — is beyond what human minds can fully grasp.
- Truth: Just because God Himself is infinite does not mean that what He reveals to humans is meant to be confusing.

2. God's Revelation Is Meant to Be Understood

- Deuteronomy 30:11-14 (NIV):
"Now what I am commanding you today is not too difficult for you or beyond your reach... The word is very near you; it is in your mouth and in your heart so you may obey it."
- Deuteronomy 29:29 (NIV):
"The secret things belong to the LORD our God, but the things revealed belong to us and to our children forever."
- Conclusion: God gave His Word to be
 - Read
 - Understood
 - Followed
- He did not give us a book of mysteries that only "special" humans could understand.

3. Revelation in the Spirit vs. Revelation in the Flesh

- John in Revelation saw visions in the Spirit (Revelation 1:10).
- These visions are about heavenly and future events, naturally harder to grasp.
- BUT everyday commandments, worship, and the nature of God for us now — these were revealed simply and clearly.

Spiritual visions = harder to understand.

Moral and doctrinal truth = made simple for humans.

4. Biblical Language Is Human-Level, Not Divine Confusion

- Greek 'Apokalypsis' (Revelation): αποκάλυψις (ah-poh-KAH-loo-
psis) = "unveiling, uncovering"
- Greek 'Mystērion' (Mystery): μυστήριον (moos-TEE-ree-on) =
"something once hidden, now revealed"

Meaning:

- Mysteries in Scripture were given to be revealed, not hidden forever.
- God's communication is clear and understandable for human minds.

5. God's Character: Reason, Not Confusion

- Isaiah 1:18 (NIV):
"Come now, let us reason together," says the LORD.
- 1 Corinthians 14:33 (NIV):
"For God is not a God of disorder but of peace."
- Greek 'akatastasias' (disorder): ἀκαταστασίας (ah-kah-tah-stah-
SEE-ahs) = "confusion, instability, chaos"

Meaning:

- God wants logical order and peace, not mystery or chaos.
- Doctrines that cause confusion (like the Trinity) do not reflect God's nature.

6. Clear Teaching About God

- John 17:3 (NIV):
"Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent."
- Fact: God is clearly said to be "the only true God."
- Jesus is the Messiah sent by God — not "God the Son" in a Trinity.

The Bible reveals:

- One God: The Father.

- One Messiah: Jesus.
- No confusion. No Trinity.

7. Practical Application

- 2 Timothy 3:16-17 (NIV):
"All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness."
- The Bible is meant to equip human beings to live righteously.
- It is designed to be understood.
- If a doctrine makes God incomprehensible, it is a sign that the doctrine is wrong, not that God is wrong.

8. Summary

- God's full nature is infinite — yes, beyond us.
- God's revealed Word is human-level — clear, logical, comprehensible.
- Trinitarians falsely claim mystery to cover the contradictions in their man-made doctrine.
- Unitarians honor God's truth by reading His Word literally, plainly, and faithfully.

Bottom Line:

God is infinite. His truth is not. His Word is clear, understandable, and meant to lead humans to salvation — not confusion
